NZ TOUR A GREAT SUCCESS

The BlueScope Steel Cricket Squad returned from their successful NZ South Island tour with 4 confident wins against regional representative sides.

The first match against Otago at Timaru was well played out, despite the boys having to acclimatise to South Island's indecisive weather. Through solid partnerships and with the bat squad members Luke Bertram (65), David Murphy (70), Siergeel Chadhry (50), Chris Nation (56) set the target of 310. Otago made an impressive run chase right down to the last 4 overs forcing the visiting side to tighten their fielding, Tour Captain Chris Nation taking 4/43 to break Otago chase and seal the win. The visitors beat Otago by 18.



Match three against an invitational side Christchurch Selwyn Assoc. was another unrivalled match with top scorer Alex Lebsanft (125*), Josh Lehane (92*) who was accidentally sent in to retire early by the incorrect scorekeeping, Chris Nation (86), Dean Tyson (25) all displayed confidence with the bat. Siergeel "Chad" Chadhry took the price wicket of their captain 1/24. Squad Coach Wayne Livermore was impressed with their pressure in the field. A tour high score of 408 defeating Christchurch Selwyn's 85.

The final match v's Canterbury Country saw top scorer Jake Harding (39), David Reid (37), Sam Cahill (30), Luke Bertram (23), David Murphy (18). Canterbury made the runs difficult to come by & IAS managed 230. Fielding, Chris Nation was on 3 separate hat tricks taking 6/45 on 7 overs, dismissing Canterbury for 106.



Captain Chris Nation was selected as player of the tour, ably supported by Josh Lehane, David Reid, Alex Lebsanft, David Murphy, Luke Bertram, Dean Tyson and Chad Chadhry having memorable moments.
