SCOTT'S BIGGEST CAREER WIN

Cyclist Scott Law had a busy time last month and earned some money for his efforts as well. Just before Christmas Scott raced at the NSW junior championships at the Dunc Gray Velodrome.



Racing in the U19 category, Scott was pipped by 0.27 seconds in the 1k time trial and had to settle for 2nd. Next up was the Keirin final in which he was successful.

The last event on the program was the Omnium championship. This race consists of a 200m time trial, a 20 lap scratch race, a 60 lap points race and concludes with a 1k time trial. Scott raced well, but had to settle for 2nd place once again.

On Boxing Day he competed in the La-trobe wheel race in Tasmania. This is a handicapped race with \$7500 prize money up for grabs. With the scratch makers working hard, the whole field came together as a bunch with 3 laps to go.

With half a lap to go Scott made his move around the outside with a phenomenal sprint that saw him take out the biggest win of his career so far. In so doing, he beat the highly rated Victorian Leigh Howard and Ed Wilson.

SALLY CROWNED WORLD JNR CHAMP

Sally Fitzgibbons achieved her biggest triumph of her career to date - claiming for the second time, the 2007 ASP World Junior Champion title which was held at Sydney's North Narrabeen Beach this week.



Surfing through four rounds, Sally netted four of the highest scoring waves and two highest heat totals of the event.

To top it off, Sally posted over a nine-point ride in every heat and also producing a perfect score of 10.

Sally became the third straight Australian winner of this event, following in the footsteps of Jessi Miley-Dyer (2005) and Nicola Atherton (2006) and now along side elite world champion Stephanie Gilmore of Australia. Well done Sally!
