HURLEY CLEANS OUT ASCC

2006 Sydney Water swimmer of the year, Robert Hurley (pictured right), has had a meet to remember. Competing at the 2008 Australian Short Course Championships in Melbourne, Hurley finished with four gold and one bronze medal.



He did the double in the backstroke winning both the 100 and 200m events. He also won the 400m freestyle race before finishing second in the 1500m race, behind Great Britain's Alderton.

As the first Aussie home, he becomes the national short course champion in a personal best time of 14.55.42. His bronze medal came in the 200m freestyle event.

Also swimming at this meet was Megan Newell (pictured right). Newell was a member of the Warilla Bowls & Recreation sponsored Athletes with a Disability program. Newell's best results were a 4th place finish in the 50m breaststroke, a 7th in the 100m breaststroke and 7th in the 200 individual medley.
