Also in Hockey, graduate Emma Cobbin (**Pictured right**) made her debut for the NSW Arrows on last weekend in Tasmania.

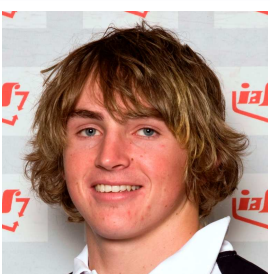


She celebrated her achievement by scoring NSW's first goal in their 3-2 win over Canberra on the Sunday.
